1	Dendrobium nobile	Temperate coastal areas	Hardy and tolerant of cool winters, blooms well in spring.
2	Cattleya labiata	Subtropical and tropical regions	Prefers warm days and cooler nights; vibrant flowers.
3	Phalaenopsis amabilis	Tropical and subtropical areas	Moth orchid; easy to grow indoors or in warm shaded areas.
4	Oncidium Sharry Baby	Coastal Queensland, NSW	Fragrant flowers; tolerant of moderate light.
5	Vanda coerulea	Tropical north Queensland	Cooler hybrids can survive in shaded warm areas.
6	Paphiopedilum insigne	Subtropical areas	Slipper orchid; enjoys shaded, humid conditions.
7	Epidendrum radicans	Northern NSW, QLD	Easy-growing terrestrial orchid; flowers abundantly.
8	Masdevallia veitchiana	Cool highland regions	Prefers cool, humid conditions; bright flowers.
9	Cymbidium ensifolium	Tropical to subtropical	Compact Cymbidium; fragrant flowers.
10	Dendrobium speciosum	NSW coastal areas	Australian native; hardy and showy flowers.
11	Miltonia spectabilis	Tropical/subtropical highlands	Pansy orchid; fragrant and shade-tolerant.
12	Brassavola nodosa	QLD coast, northern NSW	Fragrant night-blooming; easy care.
13	Catasetum pileatum	Tropical areas	Exotic tropical; bright flowers, dormant in winter.
14	Dendrobium kingianum	NSW, SE QLD	Hardy; tolerates frost, popular native orchid.
15	Phragmipedium kovachii	Greenhouse/tropical controlled environments	Exotic slipper orchid; needs warmth and humidity.
16	Odontoglossum crispum	Cooler highland areas	Prefers cool, humid conditions; showy flowers.
17	Laelia purpurata	Coastal and subtropical	Beautiful flowers; requires bright light.
18	Miltoniopsis roezlii	Cool to temperate	Pansy orchids; prefer cooler climate and shade.
19	Corymborkis veratrifolia	Tropical forested areas	Tropical terrestrial orchid; easy to maintain in warm humid areas.
20	Bulbophyllum medusae	Tropical/subtropical	Exotic, unusual flowers; needs warm humid conditions.
